DISCUSSION / BACKGROUND

The El Dorado Hills Fireworks and Freedom Concert is coming back after a three year break due to Covid. To provide a fun, safe and secure event, EDSO, CHP, EDH Fire and private security has to attend. The expenses for security have increased dramatically, but need to be funded for the safety of the attendees. They must hire EDSO, EDH Fire (which hasn't charged in the past, but with their new policies will have a bill of \$5500 this year), CHP comes in at over \$9000, two private security companies comes in about \$9500 for both, as well as the efforts to move people out safely to and from the event with the road closures that cost \$18,000. Just for safety logistics the bill this year will be \$47,000. This does not include the fireworks, entertainment, rentals, and other costs. The community funding will help pay for a part of the safety logistics which is greatly needed to continue this community event.

support of these efforts.
