- 4) Approve and authorize the Board Chair to execute Amendment V to Agreement 3370 with The Center for Violence-Free Relationships to extend the term one year through June 30, 2024 and increase the not-to-exceed amount by \$79,884 for an updated not-to-exceed amount of \$420,804.

DISCUSSION / BACKGROUND

On August 18, 2022, the District Attorney's Office received notification from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) that they intend to fund the department for participation in the Violence Against Women Vertical Prosecution (VV) Program in the total project amount of \$270,060. This will be the District Attorney's fifth consecutive award under this grant Program. The purpose of this program is to vertically prosecute violent crimes against the vulnerable adult population.

The funding provided by this program will continue to support 1.0 FTE Deputy District Attorney, 1.0 FTE Victim Advocate through a contract with The Center for Violence-Free Relationships (The Center), a District Attorney Investigator on a part-time basis to meet the cash match requirement, and as-needed operating expenses. The objective of this project is to improve the prosecution of Violent Crimes Against Vulnerable Adult Victims by creating a project team with a reduced caseload that can expeditiously conclude cases, reduce victim trauma, and enhance our services to victims.

Amendment V to Agreement 3370 with The Center will cover service period January 1, 2023 - December 31, 2023 and allow the Victim Advocate to provide a multitude of services to victims of violence. This includes being available 24-hours a day to respond to a victim's need for advocacy and assistance, as well as providing contact and referral of resources to victims in a swift manner. The Amendment increases the hourly billing rate for the Victim Advocate from \$6,100/month to \$6,347/month, increases the allotted funds for training and a cell phone stipend by \$3,720, extends the term of the agreement one additional year, and incorporates an updated Exhibit A-2 (Operational Agreement). All contract costs will be directly funded by the grant award.

ALTERNATIVES

Should the Board opt not to approve the District Attorney to accept the grant award and execute Amendment V to Agreement 3370, the County would be ineligible to participate in the Program.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no change to Net County Cost. Funding is included in the FY 2022-23 budget. The total project award of \$270,060 carries with it a match burden of \$67,515. The grant application submitted identified using staff cell phone costs, training costs, the District Attorney Investigator's salary/benefit

costs, and a portion of the Deputy District Attorney's salary/benefit costs to fulfill the match requirement. In the event the combination of these expenses is not sufficient to fulfill the match requirement, the County would be responsible for the difference.
