2) Authorize the Chair to execute an agreement for same in the amount of \$260,000 for a term of one year, upon County Counsel and Risk Management review and approval.

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REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: At the request of the Department of Transportation, the Procurement and Contracts Division solicited Requests for Qualifications and Statements of Interest for on-call application of slurry seal for various County roads. Five (5) notices were mailed. One (1) to a local vendor. Two (2) responses were received; none from local vendors. Responses were received from:

Intermountain Slurry Seal of Sacramento, California
Valley Slurry Seal of West Sacramento, California

The evaluation team, comprised of staff from the Department of Transportation and Environmental Management, reviewed the respondents' qualifications based on the experience to successfully provide the full range of services necessary to complete the work; equipment and personnel available; references; ability to meet County contract requirements; ability to comply with the County's time constraints of the project; and provision of a cost proposal that is within the estimated project budget.

Intermountain Slurry Seal was selected as the most qualified contractor and with the lowest overall cost to the County.

FISCAL IMPACT/CHANGE TO NET COUNTY COST: No change in Net County Cost.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN FOLLOWING APPROVAL: Following Board approval, the Department of Transportation will process an Agreement for Services with Intermountain Slurry Seal of Sacramento, California.
