Engineering Unit's Erosion Control Program as part of the FY 11/12 Budget Addenda.

Reason for Recommendation:

The California Tahoe Conservancy (CTC) Lease Agreement # CTA-11003 (Agreement) provides for the transfer to El Dorado County (County) of twenty-five percent of the gross income from CTC leases to private individuals or groups on lands owned by the CTC in the County. Pursuant to Government Code Section 66908.3, the CTC is authorized to lease acquired lands. When such lands are within the County and are leased to private individuals or groups, the CTC must transfer twenty-five percent of the gross income of the leases to the County each year. The Agreement is the mechanism that accomplishes this transfer. Pursuant to the Budget Act of 2011, Chapter 33/11, the Legislature has appropriated \$15,300 to the CTC for transfer to the County as private lease revenue for this fiscal year. At least fifty percent of this amount is to be used for soil erosion control projects in the Lake Tahoe region, as defined in Section 66905.5 of the Government Code. All the funding provided by the previous Lease Revenue Agreement was used for soil erosion control projects and the intention is to again allocate the entire \$15,300 to soil erosion control projects.

The Agreement includes the requirement that the County sign the Contractor Certification CCC-307 regarding non-discrimination, drug-free workplace requirements, and other provisions for which certification is required when doing business with the State of California. The County's current practices are consistent with these requisites.

Action to be taken following Board approval:

- 1. The Clerk of the Board will obtain the Chair's signature on the five originals of the subject grant Amendment and associated Contractor Certification CCC-307.
- 2. The Clerk of the Board will return all five partially executed original sets and a certified copy of the Minute Order to the Department for CTC review and approval.

Action to be taken by the Department following Board approval:

1. Upon receiving the fully executed Agreement from the CTC, the Department will forward an original to the Clerk of the Board's office and retain a copy for its files.
