Ms. Garcia teaches seventh grade Math and Science. Her focus will be on the Rubicon Trail and the maintenance efforts by the County to comply with the Clean Up and Abatement Order.

Ms. Montgomery teaches eighth grade at Camino Elementary. Her focus will be on the rail corridor and the history along with marketing the asset.
