Improve collaboration across agencies, collaboratives, and communities.



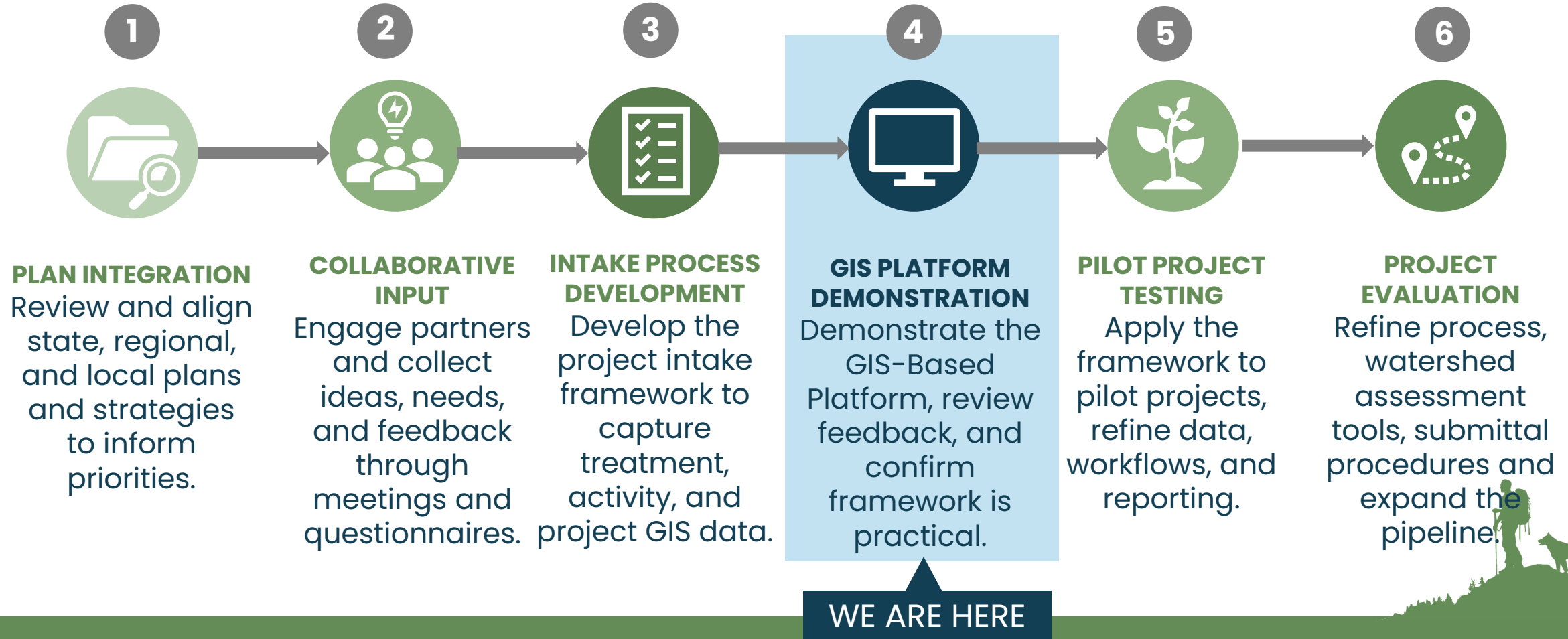

Create a pipeline to move priority projects toward implementation.

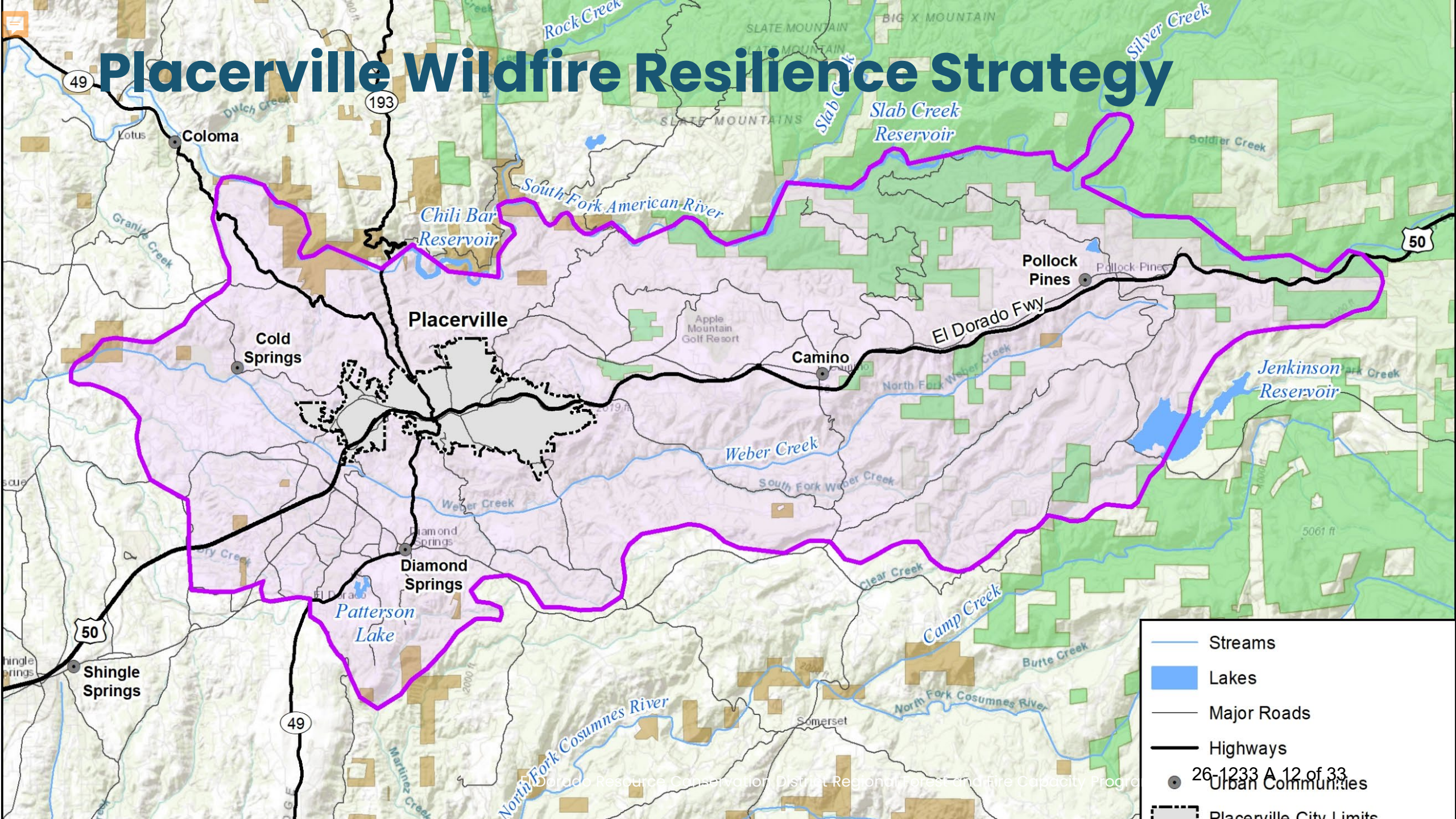

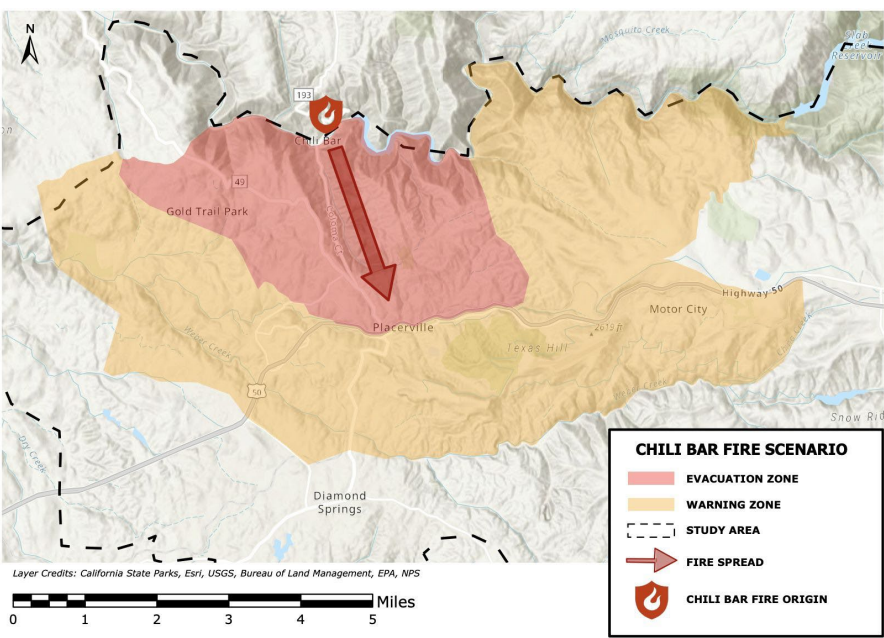


FIGURE 4. CHILLI BAR FIRE SCENARIO – FIRE ORIGIN, EVACUATION & WARNING ZONES

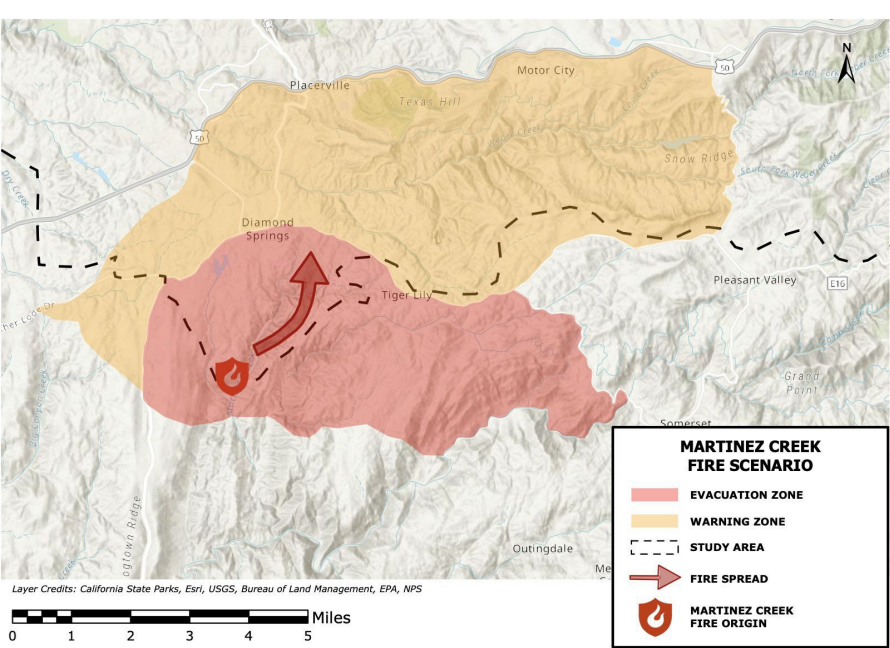


FIGURE 8. MARTINEZ CREEK FIRE SCENARIO – FIRE ORIGIN, EVACUATION & WARNING ZONES

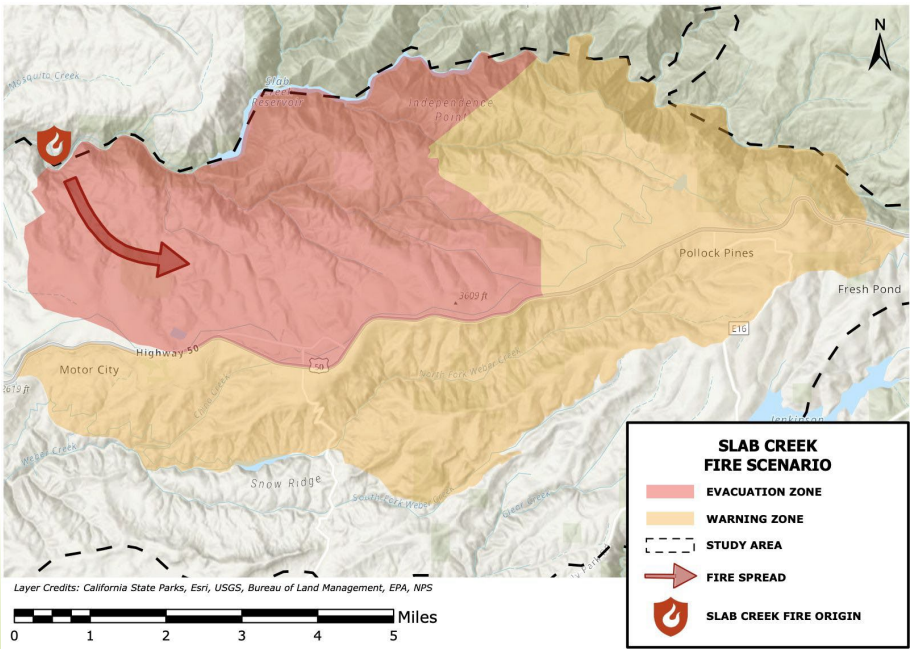


FIGURE 6. SLAB CREEK FIRE SCENARIO – FIRE ORIGIN, EVACUATION & WARNING ZONES

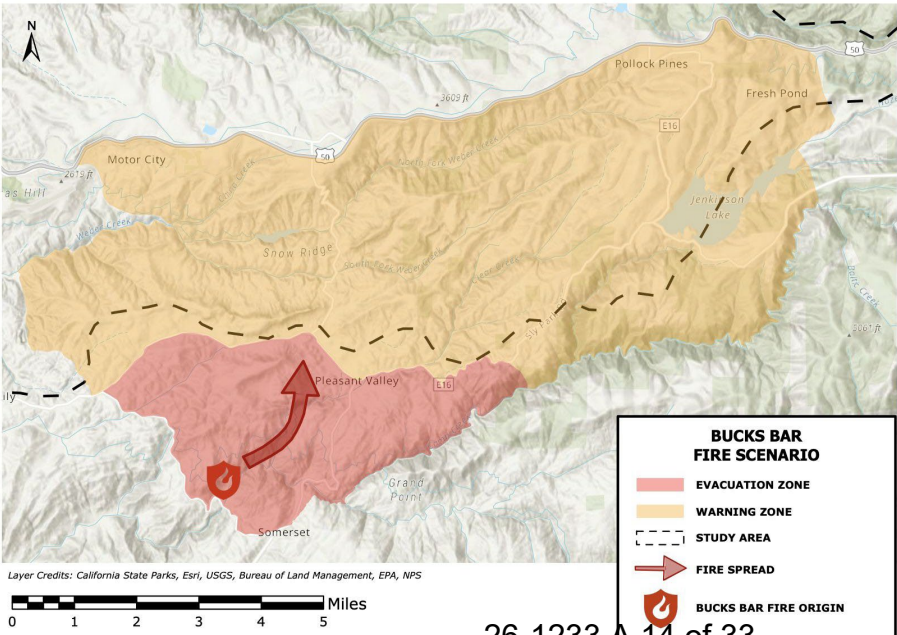
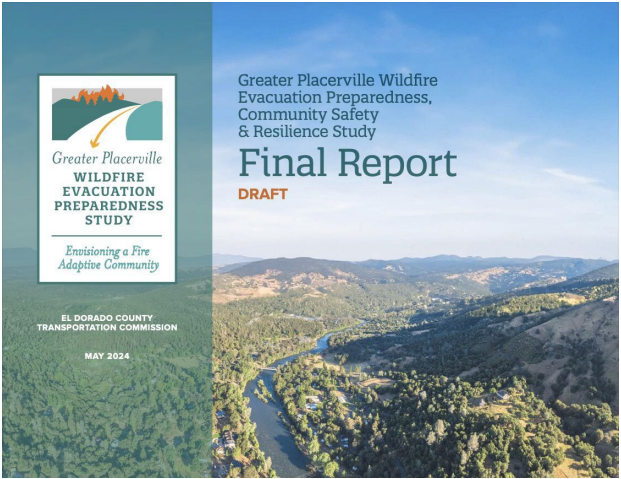
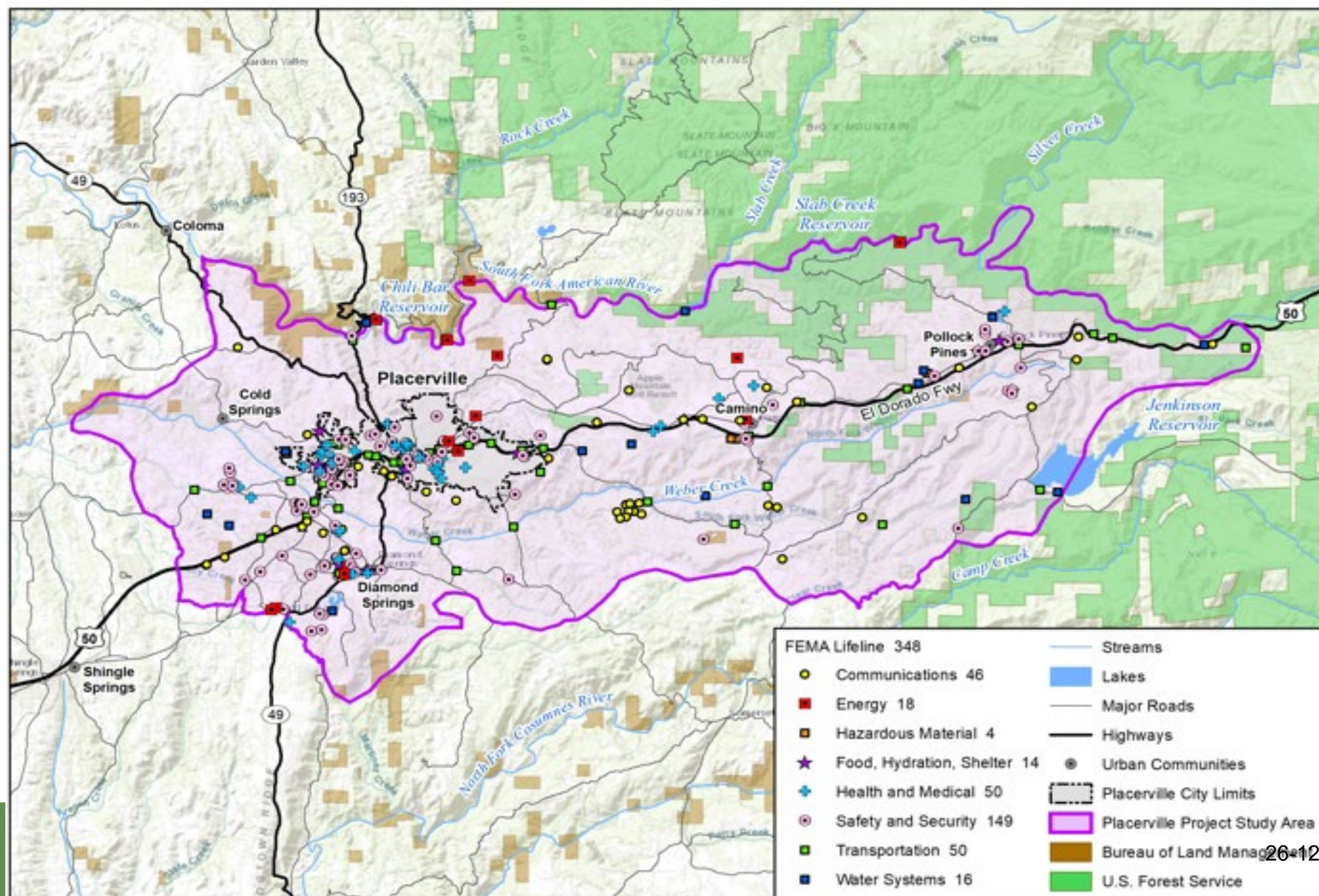
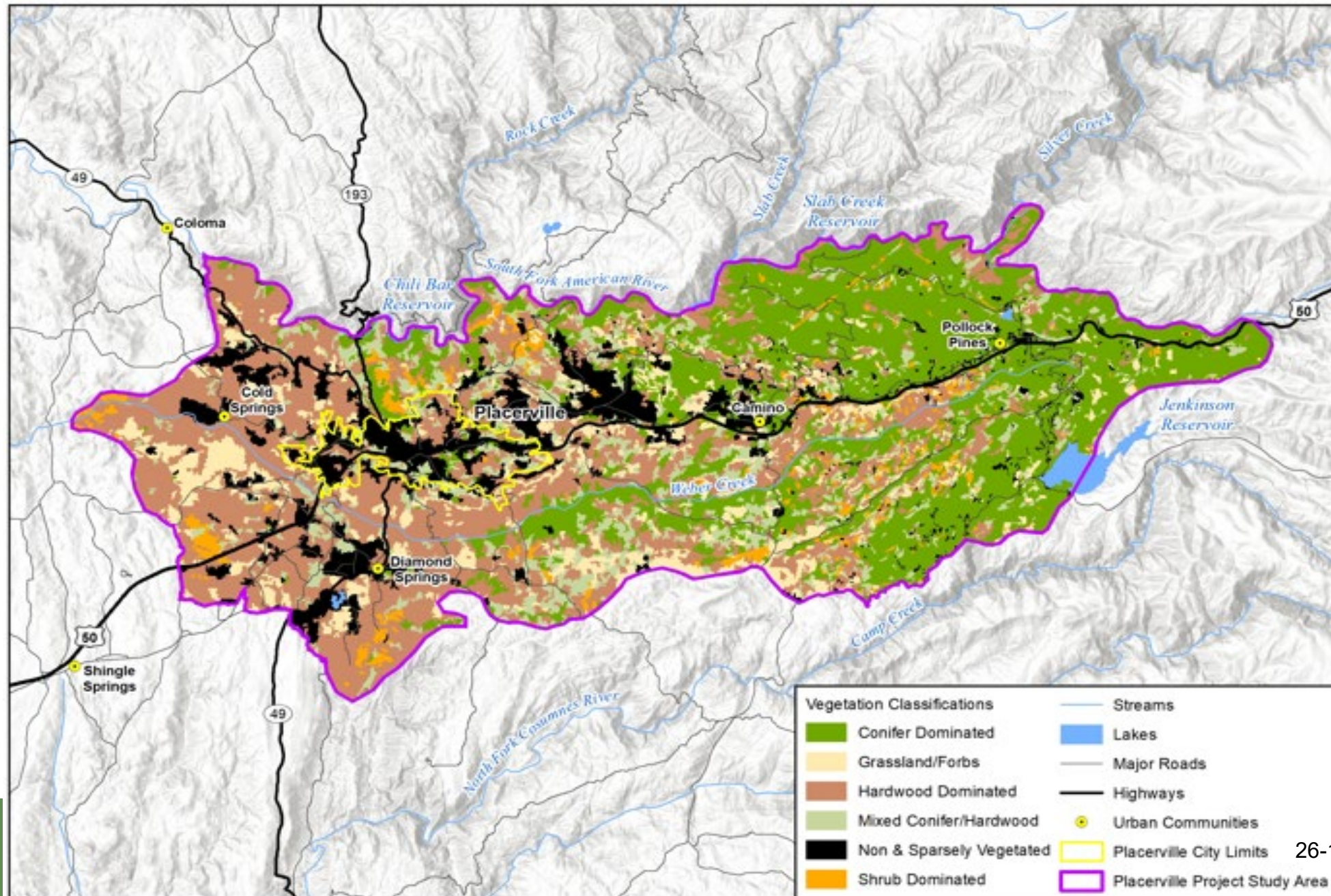


FIGURE 10. BUCKS BAR FIRE SCENARIO – FIRE ORIGIN, EVACUATION & WARNING ZONES

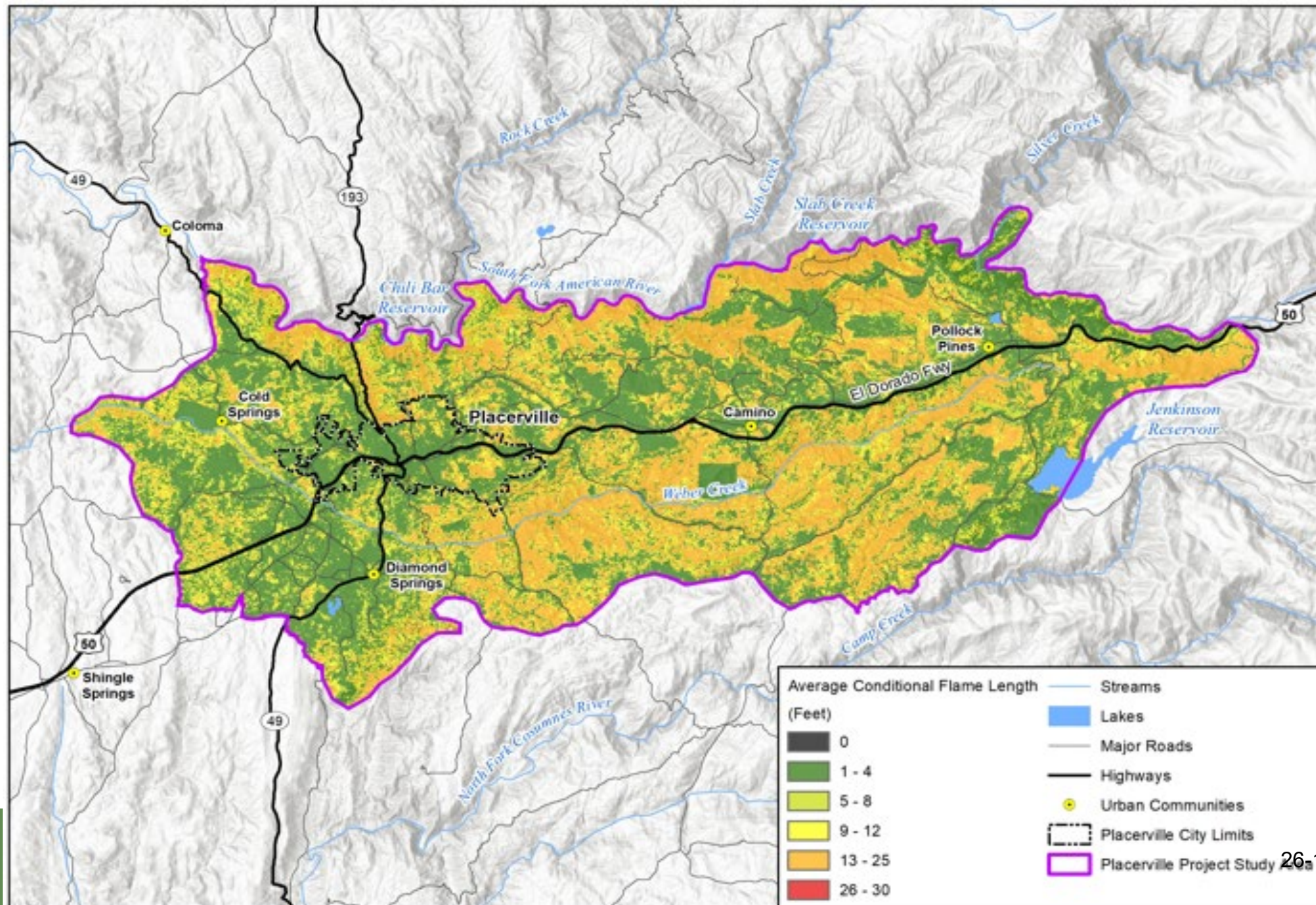

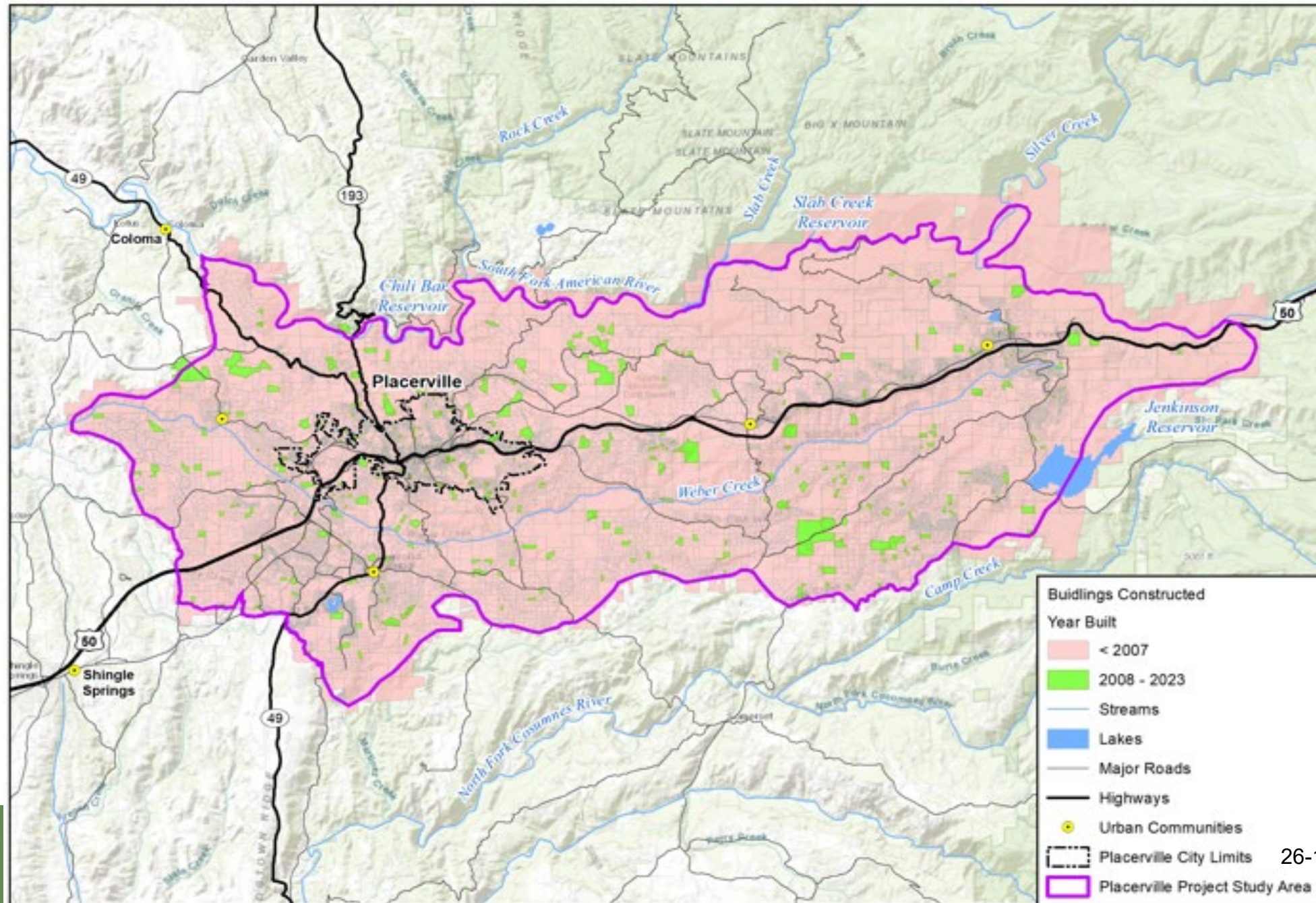
Placerville Project Study Area Vegetation Classifications

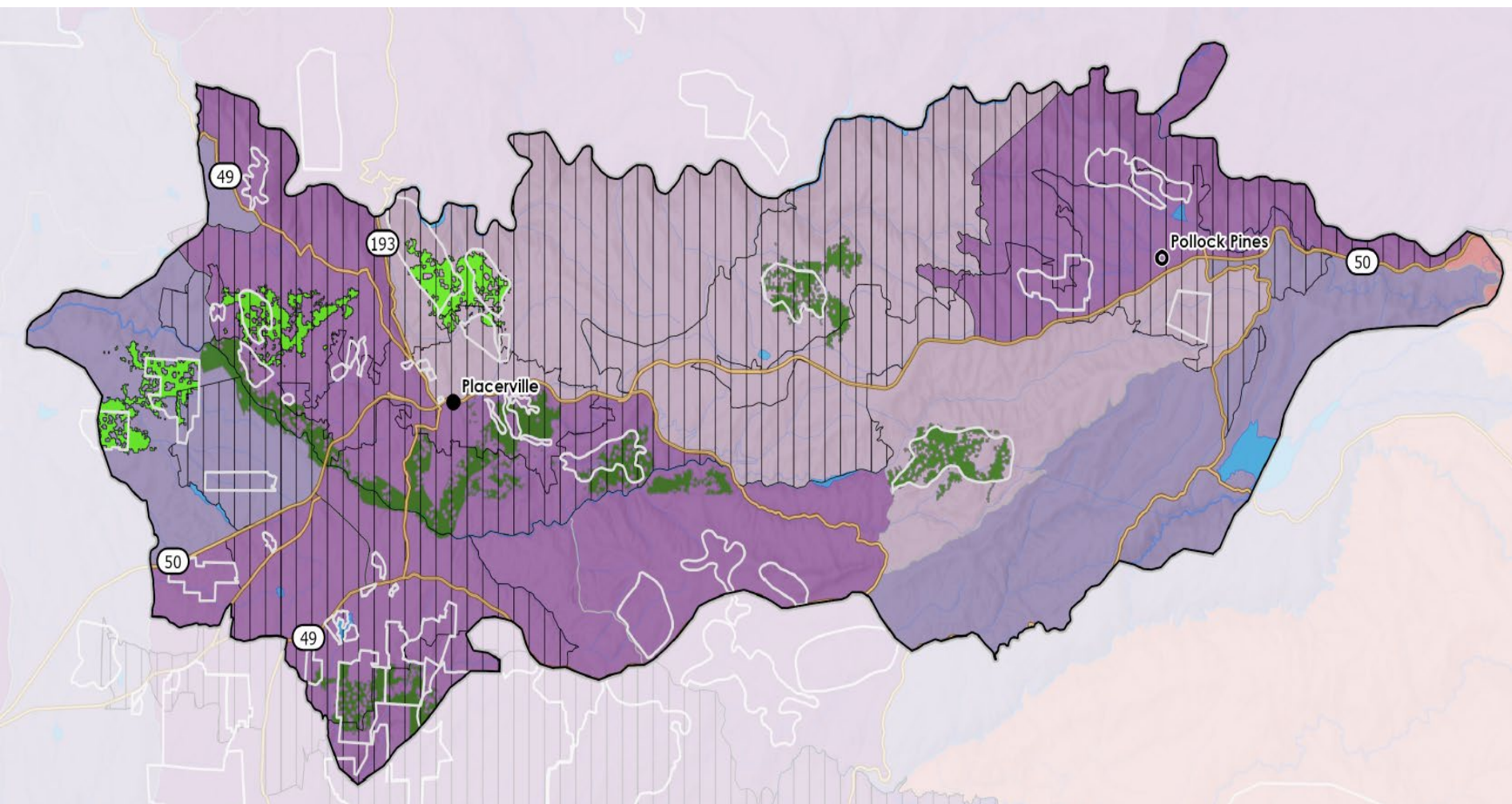


Placerville Project Study Average Conditional Flame Length

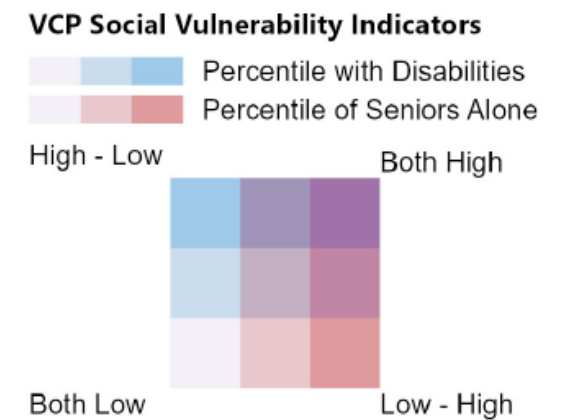
